NEEDED BUILDING RESTORATION BEING PLANNED

It is time to do some major renovation to our temple. If you have been in UNDER the lodge room recently, you would have seen the deterioration of plaster and CONSTRUCTION paint. Trying to keep our membership dues down does not allow the temple board to charge the different bodies rent that would permit us to build a maintenance fund. Therefore, we are planning to initiate a Capital Improvement Fund (as we did for our electrical upgrade 10 years ago) to restore our lodge room to its original beauty. We would like to kick this off after the first of the year. There are four major projects to be included: plaster, paint and carpet in the entire second floor. These are immediate. The fourth is more long range and that is an entire new roof. The contractor feels that with some minor repairs, we should be good for 3-5 years. Now that we have some budget estimates, our goal will be \$100,000 to \$125,000 over the next 3 years. Omega lodge had the good fortune to have some money bequeathed, plus Tuendewie's assets when they merged with us. To start the fund, Omega will pledge \$10,000. Complete details will be in the next newsletter.


Greetings Sir Knights,
