ANNUAL BREAKFAST TO SUPPORT DIABETIC KIDS' FUND

The annual Pancake-Sausage breakfast to raise funds for the Grand Council Diabetic Kids' Fund is being planned for Saturday, April 23 from 8–11 am. We are proud that Diabetes Youth Services in Lucas County is a group which receives support for their camp from Grand Council. Most of the eight camps in Ohio will be back into

full swing this summer and the Grand Council is dispersing \$60,000 to the camps for the upcoming year. The need to assist youth financially who otherwise would not be able to attend camp will continue to increase as the pandemic subsides.

Diabetic Kids' camps allow young people to be "normal" as they spend time with others with diabetes. Doctors, nurses and other health professionals work with the kids on ways to control their diabetes. Camp also provides a safe place for parents to send their children for a few days with the knowledge that their child will be safe.

Plans are being laid to again conduct all the York Rite Degrees in one day (with exception of the SEM) at the Northwest Ohio York Rite Festival in Findlay. ATTENTION ALL MEMBERS of **OC-CO-NOX-EE COUNCIL**


At a regular stated assembly on March 17, 2022 the Finance Committee will propose an amendment to our By-Laws to reflect an increase in dues from \$35 to \$60. This proposal will lay over until our next stated assembly on April 21, at which time a vote will be taken of the members present. A two-thirds majority is necessary for passage of this amendment.

The Council has been operating on a very tight budget for several years with the officers and members who attend meetings making donations to the Council in support of various projects. Due to increased operational costs for the Grand Council, the members attending the last Annual Assembly passed legislation to increase our per capita. This will take effect with our payment of Grand Council fees in 2023.

In the spirit of supporting Freemasonry as a whole, we hope that our companions will be supportive of this necessary increase of dues.

Greetings Brothers,




OES NEWS!
